### International Computer Forum in Moscow

The fourth annual *International Computer Forum and Exhibit* (ICFE) will be held June 1–4 at the World Trade Center in Moscow, Russia. The show allows worldwide companies interested in the CIS (Commonwealth of Independent States) and Eastern European countries to contact many end users, system developers, and government representatives from these countries. The exhibit is expected to attract 25,000 visitors. In addition to business issues, the conference includes sessions on many popular PC and workstation technologies. The working language is English with Russian translation.

### Client/Server Show in Boston

On June 14–16, the *Client/Server World* conference and exhibition will be held at Hynes Convention Center in Boston.
